

**Position:** Lethality Assessment Protocol (LAP) Program Intern

Reports to: LAP Program Manager

Classification: 12-15 hrs/week, hybrid remote/in-person in Chapel Hill

Pay: \$3,000 stipend (\$1,500 Fall 2025, \$1,500 Spring 2026)

Start/End: 9/1/2025-5/15/2026 (exact start/end date flexible)

The LAP Program Intern will complete comprehensive survivor advocacy training and shadowing to support survivors of domestic violence by phone and in-person at Compass Center's office in Chapel Hill, with a focus on survivors connecting to Compass Center through the LAP Program. In this role, the intern will provide crisis support, safety planning, shelter referrals, and information about domestic violence protective orders and community resources. The LAP Program intern will also assist with the administrative needs of the program alongside the LAP Program Manager.

## Core Responsibilities (12-15 hours/week)

- Approximately 3 weekly daytime shifts providing crisis support on the DV crisis and/or LAP lines or in-person during business hours (shifts are typically 9-1pm or 1-5pm but can be adjusted as needed)
- Assist the team in completing next-day LAP follow-up calls for weekend/overnight LAP referrals and coordinating resources/supports
- Attend supervision as needed with LAP Program Manager
- Communicate with Law Enforcement LAP Coordinators
- Assist with LAP screen tracking and data entry in Apricot and Forseti systems
- Assist with criminal and civil court case tracking and data entry related to LAP screens
- Support initial and refresher LAP training efforts as available
- Maintain statistical records and proper documentation on clients served

## **Intern Requirements:**

- Available to commit to internship Fall 2025 through Spring 2026 and available to work from our office in Chapel Hill from 9-1pm or 1-5pm 2-3 times per week
- Preference for students pursuing a degree in a human services/social justice related field OR equivalent experience
- Comfort talking to and assisting individuals in crisis around issues including but not limited to physical, emotional, psychological, sexual, and financial abuse
- Comfort working with all people who seek support at Compass Center, regardless of race, creed, color, national origin, age, gender, disability, sexual orientation, or gender identity
- Commitment to racial equity and anti-racism
- Willing to complete a 20+ hour advocate training and shadowing facilitated by Compass Center
- Spanish fluency preferred but not required
